# CITY OF BRIDGEPORT, NEBRASKA SPECIAL MEETING

#### I. ROUTINE BUSINESS

The City Council of the City of Bridgeport, Nebraska, met in budget special meeting at Prairie Winds Community Center, 428 Main Street, Bridgeport, Nebraska, on the 15th day of September 2021, beginning at 6:30 p.m.

Following the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America, Mayor Charlie Browne called the meeting to order. Roll call resulted as follows: Present: Dean Rahmig, Will Deines, Mark Wickard. Absent: Jason Floyd

Staff members present were: PWD Larry Heinrich

Mayor Browne presided, and Deputy Clerk Hoxworth recorded the proceedings.

Mayor Browne announced, "In accordance with Section 84-1412 of the Nebraska Revised Statutes, the open meetings act is posted at the back of the meeting room for the review of the public."

Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in the Bridgeport News-Blade, the designated method of notice given, as shown by proof of publication, as shown by attached affidavit of posting and also posting in the three designated public places; US Post Office, City Office and Prairie Winds Community Center.

Notice was given to the Mayor and all members of the City Council and a copy of their acknowledgement of receipt of notice and agenda is attached to the minutes. Availability of the agenda was communicated in the advance notice and by email notice to the Mayor and Council of this meeting. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the public.

The Mayor asked if there were any letters of public correspondence for the board. There were none.

The Mayor asked if there are any visitors that would like to speak on an item that is not on the agenda. There were none.

## III. ORDINANCES AND RESOLUTIONS

7. Mayor Browne suggested to waive the three readings as the budget needs to be to the state by September 20, 2021.

Council Member Wickard introduced Ordinance No. 979, AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING FROM THE FUNDS AND REVENUES OF THE CITY OF BRIDGEPORT, NEBRASKA SUCH SUMS OF MONEY AS HAVE BEEN DEEMED NECESSARY TO DEFRAY ALL NECESSARY EXPENSES AND LIABILITIES OF THE CITY OF BRIDGEPORT, NEBRASKA, FOR THE FISCAL YEAR COMMENCING OCTOBER 1, 2021 TO SEPTEMBER 30, 2022, AND LEVYING TAXES FOR SUCH CITY AND FOR SAID FISCAL YEAR FOR CERTAIN OBJECTS AND PURPOSES FOR WHICH SUCH APPROPRIATIONS ARE MADE AND THE AMOUNT APPROPRIATIONS ARE MADE AND THE AMOUNT APPROPRIATE FOR EACH OBJECT AND PURPOSE AND PROVIDING FOR THE CERTIFICATION OF THIS ORDINANCE TO THE COUNTY CLERK OF MORRILL COUNTY, NEBRASKA, AND PRESCRIBING THE TIME WHEN THIS ORDINANCE SHALL BE IN FULL FORCE AND EFFECT; REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES AND PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH; AND ORDERING THE PUBLICATION OF THE ORDINANCE IN PAMPHLET FORM; AND TO PROVIDE FOR PUBLICATION OR POSTING AS REQUIRED BY LAW, and moved that the statutory rule requiring reading on three different days be suspended, seconded by Council Member Rahmig. Roll call resulted as follows: Aye: Wickard, Rahmig, Deines; Nay: None. Motion carried. The motion to suspend the rules was adopted by three-fourths

of the Council and the statutory rule was declared suspended for consideration of said ordinance. Ordinance No. 979 was then read by title and thereafter. Council Member Wickard moved final passage of the ordinance, which motion was seconded by Council Member Rahmig. The Mayor then stated the question: "Shall Ordinance No. 979 be passed and adopted?" Roll call resulted as follows: Aye: Wickard, Rahmig, Deines; Nay: None. Motion carried. The passage and adoption of said ordinance having been concurred in by a majority of all members of the Council, the Mayor declared the ordinance adopted and the Mayor, in the presence of the Council, signed and approved the ordinance and the Deputy Clerk attested to the passage and approval of the same and affixed her signature thereto.

8. Council Member Deines introduced Resolution 2021-07, and moved that the resolution be adopted, seconded by Council Member Wickard. Roll call resulted as follows: Aye: Deines, Wickard, Rahmig; Nay: None. Resolution passed.

#### **RESOLUTION NO. 2021-07**

A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BRIDGEPORT, NEBRASKA SETTING THE PROPERTY TAX REQUEST FOR THE 2021-2022 BUDGET YEAR

**WHEREAS**, Nebraska Revised Statute 77-1601.02 provides that the property tax request for the prior year shall be the property tax request for the current year for purposes of the levy set by the County Board of Equalization unless the Governing Body of the City of Bridgeport, Nebraska, passes by a majority vote a resolution or ordinance setting the tax request at a different amount; and

**WHEREAS**, a special public hearing was held as required by law to hear and consider comments concerning the property tax request; and

**WHEREAS**, it is in the best interests of the City of Bridgeport that the property tax request for the current year be a different amount than the property tax request for the prior year.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Bridgeport, Nebraska, by a majority vote, resolves that:

- 1. The 2021-2022 property tax request be set at \$406,380.00.
- 2. A copy of this resolution be certified and forwarded to the County Clerk on or before September 20, 2021.

## **RESOLUTION NO. 2021-08**

A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BRIDGEPORT, NEBRASKA AUTHORIZING ALLOWABLE ONE PERCENT INCREASE IN RESTRICTED FUNDS

**WHEREAS**, on April 2, 1998, the Nebraska Legislature passed and approved LB 898 which imposes a two and one half percent lid on certain restricted funds for local governments; and

*WHEREAS*, Neb. Rev. Stat. Section 13-519.03 (R.R.S. 1943), as amended, allows governmental units to exceed the two and one half percent limit as provided in Neb. Rev. Stat. Section 13-519.01 (R.R.S. 1943), as amended, by up to an additional one percent upon the affirmative vote of at least seventy-five percent of the governing body; and

WHEREAS, to Mayor and City Council of the City of Bridgeport, Nebraska hereby finds and determines that it is in the best interest of the City of Bridgeport that the City of Bridgeport exceed the limit as provided in Neb. Rev. Stat. Section 13-519.01 (R.R.S. 1943), as amended, by an additional one percent as allowed pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. Section 13-519.03 (R.R.S. 1943), as amended.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Bridgeport, Nebraska, that the City of Bridgeport exceed the limit as provided in Neb. Rev. Stat. 13-519.01 (R.R.S. 1943), as amended, by an additional one-percent.
